• The witness of a blind man (John 9:1-34)

Why should we witness?

- A. We are <u>commanded</u> by Christ to go:
- 1. Until the end of the age, i.e. covers all time (Matthew 28:19-20)
- 2. To the ends of the earth, i.e. covers all space (Acts 1:8)
- B. We are compelled from within
- 1. We are under <u>compulsion</u> (1 Corinthians 9:16)
- 2. We are <u>well pleased</u>-to impart the gospel (1 Thessalonians 2:8)
- C. We are qualified
- 1. Approved and entrusted with the gospel (1 Thessalonians 2:4)
- 2. We are <u>ambassadors</u> for Christ (2 Corinthians 5:19-20)
- 3. We are a royal priesthood, i.e. "bridge builders" (1 Peter 2:9-10)

How do we witness?

- A. Christ's example: "The Woman at the Well" (John 4:1-42)
- 1. He broke through cultural <u>barriers</u> (John 4:7)
- a. She was a woman (John 4:7, 27)
- b. She was a Samaritan (John 4:9)
- 2. He avoided non-moral issues (John 4:7)
- She was probably a woman of ill-repute
- 3. He addressed her felt needs (John 4:10)
- 4. He ministered to her real needs (John 4:14)
- 5. He did not judge harshly (John 4:17-18)
- 6. He remained focused (John 4:20-21)
- 7. He spoke clearly about Himself (John 4:26)
- B. Paul's example: "All things to all men" (1 Corinthians 9:19-22)
