Passage

I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit. Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. If anyone does not abide in me he is thrown away like a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples. As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.

NOTE: A true believer ${\bf cannot}$ lose their salvation -relationship with the Lord. (John 10:28) The withered branch still possesses the same nature as the Vine, but it is no longer attached in the sense of life-drawing fellowship.

Loss of Fellowship - Cast out - Not Abiding

- b. Loss of Vitality Withered Possessing no life! Dead and dried up now there is deadness where there used to be life. There is weakness where there used to be power. There is emptiness where there used to be fullness. God counsels us to come back and ______that long fellowship. Once again start to draw that life giving nutrients from the Vine and begin again to produce fruit for Him.

Abide: In the Body (Sarah Jenison, South Upper Room)

Waking up early Sunday morning and getting dressed in "church clothes" to go hang out with "church people" and then coming home to make a "church lunch" can feel daunting. Getting off the cozy couch on Tuesday evening when it is dark and cold outside to go to someone else's house for "Bible Study" can feel draining. Getting that text from someone who wants to "hang out" so they can ask you awkward, personal questions and "get to know you" can feel...disturbing. And one asks oneself "how in the world is God glorified by this?" We will be walking through Paul's letter to the Ephesians to understand what he meant when he said "to [God] be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen."

Abide: Remaining Teachable (Paula Neal, Library)

Do you regularly approach Scripture with an attitude of "What do you want to teach me today Lord"? Do you humbly welcome His teaching and the change it will bring into your life? We remain teachable when we heed the call to abide in our Savior and for His words to abide in us. We can succeed at being teachable by actively pursuing opportunities to be confronted by His word and responding to it with a tender heart. During this breakout session, we will discuss our need to be teachable and responsive toward God and His word, learning from biblical saints, such as King Josiah, whom God called "humble and tender hearted" (2 Chronicles 34:14-28).

Abide: Renewed Daily (Dina Hobart, Room 104)

In Romans 12:1-2, Paul appeals to believers to "present your bodies as a living sacrifice...to God, which is your spiritual worship." Have you ever wondered what it means to truly live your life for God? Or how we can abide in Christ and daily give ourselves, all of ourselves, to God? In this breakout session, we will explore Romans 12:1-2 together and see the importance of being "transformed by the renewal of your mind." Come ready to learn practical ways to daily renew our minds and to be a living sacrifice!

Abide: Through Service (Debbie Kross, Room 101)

When life is so demanding of our time, that we feel like we can't add another thing to our plate, someone calls to see if we can host Growth Group at our house. "Oh, and can you also provide snack?" Or we get a call on Saturday night to see if we can help in the nursery on Sunday morning, 1st service? How do we continue to live out 1 Peter 4:7-11 by "loving one another, being hospitable without complaining, and using our special gifts by serving one another?" God promises to supply the strength we need, so He may be glorified! In this breakout session, we will be talking about our gifts of service, with and emphasis on Hospitality. What exactly does it look like to be hospitable?

Abide: Without Worry (Courtney Jenison, North Upper Room)

The world we live in is not without fearful situations. We live in a sinful fallen world and have continual reminders of this truth daily. For anxious people, the world around us can cause us great stress and turn us away from the Lord. Jesus knew that fear and worry were common temptations for men and women, so it's no surprise that the command to "not fear" is among the most common. In "Abide: Without Worry," we will be studying Jesus' words to not worry about our life but instead to "seek first the kingdom of God." We will have an opportunity to identify the sin of worry, how it keeps us from obeying Christ properly, and what it means to seek the kingdom of God.

Abide: Remaining Teachable

2 Chronicles 34:14-28

Background of 2 Chronicles 34:

The Holy Scriptures had been lost/hidden for many generations, consequently the Israelites were living in grave sin. God stirred young King Josiah's heart to rebuild the temple of the Lord. During the temple refurbishing the scriptures were found in a hidden place. When King Josiah heard the words of God, he immediately responded with broken heartedness and grief over the sin of his forefathers and contemplated his reverent fear of God's impending wrath. vv14-19

King Josiah sent servants to confirm that what he heard from God's Word was correct. The God of Israel replied through the prophetess Huldah by saying to young Josiah:

"because your heart was tender and you humbled yourself before God when you heard his words against this place and against its inhabitants, and because you humbled yourself before Me, tore your clothes and wept before me, I truly have heard you," declares the LORD." (v27)

The Lord tells Josiah that he will be spared the wrath coming on his people. Josiah goes on to share God's Word with the people and makes a covenant before the Lord to keep His commands with all his heart and soul.

As their king, Josiah had the people join him in this covenant. vv28-33

Remaining teachable requires becoming tender hearted and humble.

In this passage God commends Josiah for being:

Tender hearted - soft, easily bent, kind, contrite, delicate, easily moved to compassion

Being tender-hearted is not - being gullible, taken advantage of, being stepped all over. It is also not being hard, tough, or stubborn. The word tender is often used in scripture to describe young plants, branches, sprouts, or shoots that are soft and easily trained to go in a particular direction.

We can work at being tender-hearted as God commends by being:

Tender before God

"But He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness." Most gladly, therefore, I will rather boast about my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. Therefore I am well content with weaknesses, with insults, with difficulties,... for Christ's sake; for when I am weak, then I am strong." 2 Corinthians 12:9-10

- Weaknesses: want of strength, want to understand (see the need)
- Dwell in: take possession of, live in, Christ working within and giving help
- Content: pleased with, take pleasure in, to think it good, be willing, to choose
- Weak: to purposefully abstain from use of strength, not hold sway over others

Tenderness before God is not weakness as we may think of it, instead it results in strength. When we empty ourselves so His power can work through us, then we have strength in Christ, allowing us to serve Him and His creation well.

Tender toward the Word

"...we also constantly thank God that when you received the Word of God which you heard from us, you accepted it not as the word of men, but for what it really is, the Word of God." 1 Thessalonians 2:13

We first need to recognize the Word for what it is—words from our heavenly Father directly to us as a believer, no matter who we are, how or where we live, or what era we live in. It is timeless.

"Let the word of Christ richly dwell within you." Colossians 3:16

- Let: to dwell in one and influence one for good
- Richly: abundantly (large quantities, expansive)
- Dwell: to live in, to be at home (be comfortable)

Being tender toward the Word is allowing it to work in us, allowing it to change us, to bend us as a new sprout of a plant

"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and **bring** to your remembrance all that I have said to you." John 14:26

- Bring: recall to mind, cause one to remember

God the Holy Spirit will bring to our mind those things He wants us to focus on in order to grow. Our part is to listen and act or obey. Being tender toward the Word is allowing the Holy Spirit to use His Word to control our hearts, minds, and lives. "God's Word is the handle by which the Holy Spirit uses to steer our lives". David Jeremiah

"How blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked,...But his delight is in the law of the Lord, and in His law he meditates day and night." Psalm 1:1-2

- Delight: pleasure, desire, longing, a valuable thing.
- Meditates: ponder, (growl or moan like a lion contemplating his caught prey)

Think about what you are going to do with what you just read. How will you apply it to your life? Do we delight in His Word? Do we delight in obeying Him? Do we see His word and obeying it as a valuable thing? If we are delighting in and meditating on His Word then we should be excited about its affect on us, and excited to see change.

Tender toward others

"Be **kind** to one another, **tender-hearted**, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you." Ephesians 4:32

- Kind: virtuous, good, pleasant, not harsh or bitter
- Tender-hearted: compassionate, sympathetic, tender affection

"...put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another." Colossians 3:12-13

- Put on: clothe yourself with, sink into, put yourself into active, requires action
- Heart of compassion: mercy, pity, longing for another's well being
- Kindness: gentleness, goodness, usefulness (what is helpful to them)
- Patience: endurance, perseverance, longsuffering, slowness in avenging wrongs

Consider others and how you would feel, putting yourself in their place, even if they annoy or irritate you.

Humble - put into subjection, be put under, to bend the knee We can work at being humble as God commends by being:

Humble before God

"Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God." 1 Peter 5:6

"Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, but **emptied** Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men." Philippians 2:5-7

- Emptied: lay aside equality, make void, lay aside force

Recognize my place in God's plan. I am to humbly put myself under His direction and acknowledge the truth of His position. He is the one to cast out my pride and replace it with Christ-like humility.

"Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own?" 1Corinthians 6:19

Humble toward the Word

"All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for **training** in **righteousness**." 2 Timothy 3:16

- Training: cultivation of mind and morals by correcting mistakes/curbing passions
- Righteousness: condition acceptable to God, integrity, virtue, correctness of thinking

All of God's words are profitable for us, and are for our sanctification.

Humble toward others

"...learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart." Matthew 11:29

- Gentle: meek, mild, humble
- Lowly: low in spirit, deferring servilely to others (excessive willingness to serve)
- In heart: center of the physical and spiritual, seat of the thoughts, passions, desires, appetites, affections, intelligence, will, character

Learn from Christ's example-He is just as humble toward God (empting himself for God's use) as He is toward man.

"Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others." Philippians 2:3-4

"...and whoever would be first among you must be your slave, even as the Son of man came not to be ministered to, but to minister and to give his life a ransom for many." Matthew 20:27-28

"Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, **meekness**, and patience, bearing with one another." Colossians 3:12-13

"A closer look at the word meek: The Greeks called their horses praus, or meek. When the horse got to the level of training where it would obey the master (the rider) no matter what was going on, it could be trusted in the heat of battle not to do something foolish. Once the rider knew that he could trust the animal, and it would obey him no matter what, he called it a meek horse even though it might be a powerful, thoroughbred stallion, capable of killing enemies in the battle."

Humility - The Beauty of Holiness, Andrew Murray

Teachable -able to be taught, capable of being instructed, Webster's Dictionary

We have the best opportunity to be teachable by remaining tender and humble toward God, His Word, and others. It would be of great value for us to put ourselves in places of opportunity to hear the Word, to allow for right focus and growth in Christ.

"...and let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds, not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another..." Hebrews 10:25

Teachability includes the willingness to seek, hear, and consider or act upon the godly counsel of others. We can seek opportunities to encourage others and be encouraged ourselves, valuing the godly guidance of others. God works through people and events He puts in our lives, wanting us to live fruitful, joyous lives.


Let us examine ourselves and look for where we can be teachable in our lives.

Abide: Through Serving For God's Glory

1 Peter 4:7-11

"7 The end of all things is near, therefore, be of sound judgment and sober spirit for the purpose of prayer. 8 Above all keep fervent in your love for one another, because love covers a multitude of sins. 9 Be hospitable to one another without complaint. 10 As each one has received a special gift, employ it in serving one another as good stewards of the manifold grace of God. 11 Whoever speaks is to do so as one who is speaking the utterances of God; whoever serves is to do so as one who is serving by the strength which God supplies; so that in all things, God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom belongs the glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen."

When you think about "Abiding in Christ through serving," what comes to your mind?

When I was approached to lead a breakout session for this conference, I was asked to think about how we can abide in service in a practical way.
So, looking at the definition of "practical," it says: "Relating to, or manifested in practice or action
So how do we practice Abiding?
The word "Abide" means "to remain" or "stay around." The "remaining" is evidence that salvation has already taken place. So the fruit or evidence of salvation is shown through our service to Him.
We as believers are called to serve others, not because of them, but because of Him!
What are some areas we can serve Him?
As I'm thinking about service, I go back to the definition of practical: practice or action

There are many ways to serve, but today I would like to take a look at Hospitality.

What do the Scriptures say specifically about Hospitality?

Romans 12:9-13 gives us instructions on how a Christian should live:

"9 Love without hypocrisy, hate evil; cling to what is good. 10 Be devoted to each other, put others above yourself, 11be diligent in serving the Lord, 12 rejoice in hope, persevere in trials, be devoted in prayer. 13 contribute to the needs of others, practice hospitality."

There are other verses that speak about being hospitable:

1 Timothy 3:2 - qualification of an Elder is to be hospitable.

Hebreus 13:2 – the moral direction of the believer: the extension of love to those who were strangers. 1 Peter 4:9 – Serving for God's glory

opening up our homes to serve God, and to show love to others.

So, what exactly is Hospitality, and what does it look like?

Hospitality:

1 uke 10:38

- The friendly reception and treatment of guest, visitors, or strangers.
- The quality or disposition of receiving and treating guests and strangers in a warm, friendly, generous way.
- Vines says: Love of strangers, the act of loving strangers.

I know not many of us entertain strangers, but *Hebreus 13:2* tells us by showing hospitality to strangers, some have entertained angels, without knowing it.

We aren't quick to open up our homes to strangers off the street, like they did in ancient times, but, even then, during persecution, they didn't always know if their guests were spies or fellow believers being pursued.

There are many examples in scripture of people opening up their homes to strangers:

I love opening up our home to others. I believe our home is God's home, and everything in it. He is the one that has blessed us with all that we have, and He wants us to share it with others.

Now I'm not saying there aren't times I just don't feel like having people over. We have hosted a Growth Group in our home for over 35 yrs, and when it has been a busy week, or we're just tired, I sometimes want to put a sign on the door that says, "Growth Group has been cancelled, go away, I'm in my pajamas!"

But instead, we hustle around, and get things ready, and as people start coming in, and we become engaged in conversation, I feel so blessed, and glad that we were able to serve in this way.

I know we all have our gifts in serving, and you may be thinking, hospitality? "I'm just not good at this, or I don't really like having others over, or my house is too small (Never! When we first started hosting a Growth Group, we lived in an 1500sq. ft. house, and we had about 20 people who attended) I don't have time to clean and prepare. Whatever the excuse, remember why you serve. We are all called to serve, and be hospitable.

You may find out you're really good at it, and enjoy it, and that it is a gift that God gave you, that you didn't even know you had.

Either way, whether it's hospitality, or some other way to serve, find out where your gift of service is, and do it.

There are so many areas to serve, whether it is teaching, helping in children's ministry, handing out bulletins, selling coffee, mowing lawns, pulling weeds, or rocking babies. (I was nursery coordinator for almost 25 yrs, and rocked a lot of babies, and changed a lot of diapers, and some even grew up to be preachers!)

Our obedience to God's word brings Glory to Him, and blesses us as we Abide In Him.

Abiding Without Worry

Matthew 6: 25-34 (ESV)

25 "Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? 26 Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? 27 And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? 28 And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, 29 yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. 30 But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? 31 Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' 32 For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. 33 But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.

Isn't this what Jesus Christ should be for the Christian? Shouldn't He be our place of refuge and security? Should He not be the source of our life and strength? Shouldn't He be the reason for our fellowship with others? Shouldn't He be where our heart is?

Jesus is the True Vine. His desire is to live through our lives so that we might bear fruit to glorify our Heavenly Father.

Questions to consider:

- 1. Are you "in the Vine"? Have you ever been saved and grafted into Jesus?
- 2. Are you truly "abiding in the Vine"? Are you drawing your life nutrients and strength from Him daily so that He is able to produce His fruit through your life?"
- 3. Have you experienced God's pruning? How? Was it comfortable? Was it profitable?
- 4. Can you see Him bearing fruit in you today? As branches, should we be satisfied with a little bit of fruit here and there?

5. If we do bear fruit, we should not take the credit or glory for ourselves, but give it to the Gardener to whom it rightly belongs. How can we ensure that God gets the glory for any of our fruit?
