## Session 1 – Successful Parenting Dale Whitehead

Every parent wants to feel successful. Every parent wants to feel as if his or her efforts are paying off. This is natural and understandable for what is more important to parents than their children? There is nothing more important. And this is continuously demonstrated by the amount of time, energy and resources that parents pour into their children. In fact, for many parents if they do not feel their parenting has been successful they will feel as if there life has not been successful. So how will most parents go about measuring the success or non-success of their parenting?

1. Most parents will measure the success or non-success of their parenting by the
