2 Peter 3:7, 10-12

What does 2 Peter 3:7 say about God, about men and about sin?

Consider the view of a town or city you've seen from an overlooking hilltop. Picture the sight of a whole region from an airplane. Be certain this day that your faith is in God's grace, the forgiveness of sins through the sacrifice of Jesus, and that you have committed your life to Him as Lord.

Consider the destruction of judgment with fire. Do you view this as a horrible tragedy or with joy as God fixes what has been corrupted by sin?

Why would a believer look forward to the end of the world (see 2 Peter 3:13)?

Why is God postponing His judgment? Can you reconcile 2 Peter?

2 Peter 3:11-12 Peter supplies the application of the truth of this coming event to our lives today. Answer his question, "What sort of people ought you to be in holy conduct and godliness, looking for and hastening the coming of the day of God, on account of which the heavens will be destroyed by burning, and the elements will melt with intense heat?"
