**Sermon Notes for February 26, 1989**

**“The Wrath of God”**  
**Romans 1:18**

Introduction: Wrath is the holy revolution of God to all that is a contradiction to Him (Revelation 19:15).

If we reject the wrath of God, we are rejecting an aspect of God. Being saved we are saved from something and that something is the “wrath of God.”

1. God’s wrath is even now evident to us. Verse 18, “For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men...”

God’s wrath is also seen in our justice system (Romans 13:3-5).

God’s wrath is not evidenced continually (Romans 2:4-5). God’s wrath is present, also His forbearance and patience are present. The wrath of God is like water behind a dam; it continues to build. Through the patience of God many are saved but also His wrath builds (Revelation 19:11-19).

2. The wrath is directed at sin. Can we separate man from his sin? Psalm 5:5 “...Thou dost hate all who do iniquity.” God is a God of love so He expressed His love to those who He hates. God hates the sinner. God, in His love, moves with compassion toward that which He hated.

There is nothing good in us that draws God to us. We cannot separate the sin from the sinner. God’s wrath is directed to the sin of the man, but also to the man that sins (John 3:20-21).

What will save us from God’s wrath? Only Christ Jesus our Lord!
