## Sermon Notes for August 4-5, 2001 Dale Whitehead "Good Results from Bad Circumstances" Philippians 1:18-26

We need to know that Paul's anticipated future joy came from his assurance of ultimate salvation.

We need to know that Paul's anticipated future joy that came from his assurance of ultimate salvation was linked to the Philippians <u>prayers</u> and the provision of the Holy Spirit.

Paul is acknowledging by this statement that the continuing provision of the spirit was <u>necessary</u> for his ultimate deliverance. He also saw that a part of that supply was coming through the <u>intercessory</u> prayer of the Philippians.

Paul views himself as <u>saved</u> but that belief will not be <u>verified</u> in his mind until he crosses the <u>finish</u> line and receives the victor's crown (1 Corinthians 9:24-27).

Paul sees the prayers of the Philippians and the subsequent provision of the Spirit as essential if he is going to <u>successfully</u> run the race alluded to in 1 Corinthians 9:24-27 and receive the prize.

We are saved as we place our faith and trust in Jesus Christ <u>alone</u> for our salvation (Ephesians 2:8-9).
