Sermon Notes for April 12-13, 2003

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"The Person of Christ"

Colossians 1:13-18

- 1. Christ's relation to <u>us</u> (1:13-14)
- a. Jesus is our King (1:13)
- b. Jesus is our <u>Redeemer</u> (1:14)
- 2. Christ's relation to <u>God</u> (1:13. 15)

Note the present tense (cf. John 8:58)

- a. Jesus is the beloved Son of God (1:13)
- b. Jesus is the perfect likeness of God

"Image" (Eikon) is not a resemblance but is an exact representation (cf. Hebrews 1:3; John 14:9).

- 3. Christ's relation to Creation (1:15-17)
- a. Jesus is <u>preeminent</u> over all things (1:15)

"Firstborn" (Prototokos) can mean the first of a <u>series</u> or it can mean preeminent in <u>rank</u> (cf. Exodus 4:22; Psalm 89:27; Jeremiah 31:9; Revelation 1:5).

The translation bias of Colossians 1:16-17 in the New World Translation:

"Because by means of him all [other] things were created in the heavens and upon the earth.... All [other] things have been created through him and for him. Also he is before all [other] things and by means of him all [other] things were made to exist."

In this case, first-born must mean "preeminent" because:

1) The <u>context</u> teaches Christ's exalted place.

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3) Psalm 89:27 uses "first-born" in a sense of preeminent referring to the Messiah.

2) He is the first-born <u>of</u> all creation, not <u>in</u> creation.

4) Christ cannot be both <u>created</u> and the <u>Creator</u> of everything. Nothing can <u>create itself</u> .
5) Christ cannot be the <u>only-begotten</u> if He were the <u>first-begotten</u> of many.
b. Jesus <u>produced</u> all things (1:16)
Jesus is the Creator of everything, either <u>directly</u> or <u>indirectly</u> .
c. Jesus <u>preceded</u> all things (1:17)
The pronoun "He" is <u>emphatic</u> .
d. Jesus <u>preserves</u> of all things (1:17)
4. Christ's relation to the <u>church</u> (1:18)
a. Jesus is our <u>leader</u>
The pronoun "He" is <u>emphatic</u> .
b. Jesus is our <u>life</u>
c. Jesus is our <u>Lord</u>

It is imperative that we <u>realize</u> who Christ is so that we may <u>respond</u> to Him accordingly.
