"Pursuing God in Our World"

Colossians 4:2-6

Colossians 1 grounds the church in <u>truth</u>. Colossians 2 guards the church from <u>error</u>. Colossians 3:1-17 grows the church in relation to <u>God</u>. Colossians 3:18-4:18 grows the church in relation to <u>others</u>.

1. Be prayerful (4:2-4)

- a. <u>How</u> to pray (4:2)
- 1) Pray with <u>devotedness</u>: be <u>consistent</u>
- 2) Pray with <u>alertness</u>: be <u>circumspect</u>
- b. What to pray (4:3)
- 1) Pray for opportunities: be careful
- 2) Pray for communication: be clear
- 3) Pray for perseverance: be continuing

2. Be prudent (4:5-6)

- a. In our conduct in the world (4:5)
- 1) Be wise with our activity
 - We must avoid isolation
 - We must avoid <u>iniquity</u>
 - We must avoid insensitivity
- 2) Be wise with our opportunity

"Making the most of the opportunity," literally reads in Greek "redeeming the time." However, the word for time (KAIPOS) refers to a <u>period</u> of time, not a <u>point</u> in time. This leads to the accurate translation of "opportunity."

- We must avoid idleness
- We must avoid ineffectiveness
- b. In our conversations with the world (4:6)
- 1) Be gracious

Jesus did not come to judge but to save (John 3:17)

• We must avoid moralism

2) Be interesting

Salt in Colossians 4:6 is used for <u>seasoning</u>, a figure of speech referring to words that are <u>appealing</u> to the hearer.

• We must avoid <u>ritualism</u>

3) Be knowledgeable

Our conversations must not only be opportune with regard to $\underline{\text{time}}$, they must also be opportune with regard to the $\underline{\text{person}}$.

• We must avoid decisionism

In order to make the most of the opportunity we must not only have the opportunity but also know what to do with the opportunity. This is best learned <u>on-the-job</u>.
