"The Development of the Church"

1 Timothy 4:10-16

1. Concerned for God's World (4:10)

Our motivation to continue in the present is our confidence in the future.

We labor for our <u>future</u> and the <u>future</u> of others.

- a. God is the Savior of all potentially
- b. God is the Savior of believers actually

2. Communicating God's Will (4:11)

There are two commands regarding how we are to communicate God's will:

- a. Insisting on obedience
- b. Instructing for obedience

The present tense of the commands indicates we must do this habitually.

3. Confident in Our Weaknesses (4:12)

For the weaknesses that we <u>cause</u>, we should <u>change</u>. For the weaknesses that we do not <u>cause</u>, we should <u>continue</u>.

The remedy for our inadequacies is a godly life (2 Corinthians 12:9-10).

4. Committed to God's Word (4:13)

The public reading of the Scripture involves:

a. Exhortation, which is necessary to build up our heart (1 Thessalonians 5:14).

b. <u>Teaching</u>, which is necessary to build up our <u>mind (1 Timothy 1:3)</u>.

This is indispensable for our maturity (Colossians 1:28).

5. Continuing in God's Work (4:14)

The Scripture does not call us to <u>explore</u> but to <u>exercise</u> our spiritual gift. We neglect our spiritual gift when we fail to <u>serve</u> the <u>church</u>.

6. Captivated by God's Will (4:15)

"Progress" suggests our <u>need</u> for <u>growth</u>. "Progress" <u>stimulates</u> others for <u>growth</u>. Our <u>progress</u> is more important than our <u>position</u>.

7. Considering Our Walk (4:16)

a. Attention to our <u>behavior</u>

b. Attention to our <u>beliefs</u>

Our <u>behavior assures</u> our salvation, our <u>beliefs assist</u> others' salvation.

Persevering in the Christian life leads to sanctification, service and seeking the lost for Christ.
