## "Our Prophetic Revelation"

#### 2 Peter 1:16-21

## 1. The truthfulness of the personal witness (1:16-18)

a. The vision (1:16)

The contrast is between cleverly contrived tales and clearly compelling truth.

We know that the transfiguration is true because of the eyewitnesses.

- Their <u>plurality</u>
- Their credibility
- b. The voice (1:17)
- 1) The passages: Matthew 17:1-8; Mark 9:2-8; Luke 9:28-36
- 2) The place: Mount <u>Hermon</u>
- 3) The pronouncement

Christ was honored in what was spoken about Him.

Christ was glorified in what was done to Him.

4) The purpose

The Transfiguration was a glimpse of the kingdom of God.

c. The validation (1:18)

The disciples' role as eye-witnesses is emphasized.

## 2. The triumph of the prophetic word (1:19-21)

a. Our assurance of the Word (1:19)

The prophetic word is <u>not</u> made more sure by the transfiguration, it is more sure <u>than</u> the transfiguration.

We can have more confidence in the Scripture than even Peter had in his experience.

b. Our attention to the Word (1:19)

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The lamp illustrates the word.

The dawn illustrates the return of Christ (cf. Malachi 4:2).

The "morning star" literally means "light-bringer." When Christ returns, He will <u>illuminate</u> our hearts.

c. Our appreciation for the Word (1:20)

"First of all" speaks to what is most important.

2 Peter 1:20-21 speaks to the origin of prophecy, not to the understanding of prophecy.

d. The authorship of the Word (1:21)

God <u>guided</u> the human authors so that using their own individual <u>personalities</u>, they composed His revelation to man.

Spirit-moved writers wrote God-breathed writings (2 Timothy 3:16).

e. The authority of the Word (1:21)

Because the Bible is from God it is accurate (Titus 1:2) and authoritative.
