## Sermon Notes for February 18-19, 2006

## "Why Jesus Was Rejected"

## John 12:39-43

The first fact about Jewish unbelief is that they <u>dismissed</u> the evidence (John 12:37). The second fact about Jewish unbelief is that the unbelief of so many Jews, in spite of the evidence, fulfilled <u>prophecy</u> (John 12:38).

The third fact about Jewish unbelief in the time of Christ is that <u>God</u> was its ultimate cause (John 12:39-40).

It had been prophesied in Isaiah 53:1 that the Jews would not believe, and according to John 12:37 they did not believe, and John 12:39 is now telling us that they <u>could</u> not believe.

The explanation that the apostle gave in John 12:40 for why the Jews could not believe in John 12:39 came from a quotation in <u>Isaiah 6:9-10</u>.

The Jewish people could not believe Christ because <u>God</u> had blinded their eyes and hardened their hearts (John 12:40).

Though God blinded their eyes and hardened their hearts the blinding and hardening was not apart from or against their <u>will</u>. They were therefore responsible for their rejection of Christ.

The ultimate cause for the Jews' rejection of Christ, and in essence anybody's rejection of Christ, is found in the <u>will</u> of God (Romans 9:14-18).

God blinded their eyes and hardened their hearts so that Christ, His sacrificial lamb, might through His death on the cross take away the <u>sin</u> of the world.

We can know whether or not God has chosen to open our heart to salvation when our profession of faith produces <u>works</u> (James 2:14-20).

John clearly told us, based on John 12:41, that Isaiah had seen the glory of Christ.

Isaiah had seen the glory of Christ when he saw the Lord sitting on His throne in Isaiah 6:1-3.

Isaiah's response to what he had seen was to become Christ's messenger (John 12:41).

Isaiah's willingness to become Christ's messenger after witnessing the glory of Christ confirmed that His faith was truly <u>saving</u>.

The unwillingness of so many so-called Jewish believers in John 12:42-43 to become messengers of Christ, in spite of having seen His glory, confirmed that their faith was <u>spurious</u> (John 5:44).

Those who have been touched by God and are able to view the glory of Christ with eyes of faith will desire to become His <u>messengers</u>.
