Righteousness Directed By The Spirit Galatians 5:16-26 Gerry Andersen

As God the Father takes the primary role in our <u>creation</u>, and as God the Son takes the primary role in our <u>salvation</u>, so God the Holy Spirit takes the primary role in our <u>sanctification</u>.

1. The desire of the flesh (5:16-18)

The flesh and the Spirit battle within every believer in Christ.

In verse 16, Paul <u>emphasizes</u> that those who walk by the Spirit will not carry out the desires of the flesh.

Walking by the Spirit requires:

- <u>Having</u> the Spirit (1 Corinthians 12:13)
- The Spirit having you (Eph. 5:18-21; cf. Col. 3:16)

We are not under the Law because only the Spirit can overcome the desire of the flesh.

2. The deeds of the flesh (5:19-21)

- a. The deeds of the flesh are <u>manifest</u>
- b. The deeds of the flesh are many
- c. The deeds of the flesh <u>multiply</u>

Immoral <u>acts</u> (immorality) lead to immoral <u>living</u> (sensuality).

Anger leads to disagreements, which leads to division.

We don't just <u>want</u> what they <u>have</u> (jealousy), but we don't even <u>want</u> them to <u>have</u> it (envy).

3. The fruit of the Spirit (5:22-24)

a. The Spirit <u>demonstrated</u>

b. The law <u>denied</u>

No law is required against spiritual fruit.

c. The flesh is <u>dead</u>

This allusion to the crucifixion of Christ is the key to unleashing the power of the Spirit.

4. The following of the Spirit (5:25-26)

The method of justification <u>determines</u> the method of sanctification.

"Walk" in 5:25 is a different Greek word than "walk" in 5:16 and signifies walking in <u>line</u> behind <u>others</u>.

While we follow the Holy Spirit, our following is done in conjunction with <u>fellow</u> <u>believers</u>.

The evidence of our following of the Holy Spirit is seen in our relationship with others.

The contrast to following the Holy Spirit is an exalted view of ourselves.

When we think too highly of ourselves we demonstrate this by <u>provoking</u> others and by <u>resentment</u> of others.

The only path to freedom from the deeds of the flesh is through <u>yielding</u> to the Holy Spirit.
