## Valley Bible Church Sermon Notes for March 29, 2009

## "The Replacement of Judas" Acts 1:15-26 Gerry Andersen

Peter's address to the 120 brethren ("disciples") represented only a <u>portion</u> of the believers at this time (cf. 1 Corinthians 15:6).

## 1. The selection of Judas

- a. The <u>function</u> for Judas (1:15-17)
- 1) Judas fulfilled prophecy

Note that the words of David were considered to be <u>Scripture</u> from the Holy Spirit (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16).

2) Judas received Christ's love

Christ did not withhold Judas' portion ("lot") in the ministry.

b. The <u>defection</u> of Judas (1:18-19)

<u>Matthew 27:1-10</u> describes the defection of Judas. Judas acquired the field <u>indirectly</u> through the temple priests.

The accounts of Judas' death can be reconciled by allowing both to be true.

c. The <u>prediction</u> of Judas (1:20)

In some of the Psalms, the Messiah is anticipated as the coming King and these "royal" Psalms anticipate <u>Christ</u> In the same way, the enemies of <u>Israel</u> became enemies of the <u>Messiah</u> in the Psalms and it is in this way that Judas was predicted in Psalm 69:25 and 109:8.

God's enemies are seen in their opposition to God's people.

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## 2. The selection of Matthias

The addition of Matthias as one of the Twelve was a <u>unique</u> event to complete the number of apostles (cf. Revelation 21:14; Acts 6:2). There is no record of a successor appointed after the death of <u>James</u> (Acts 12:1-2) because Judas was replaced based on his <u>unfaithfulness</u>.

a. The <u>conditions</u> for an apostle (1:21-22)

They must have been with Jesus during His <u>entire</u> earthly ministry. The phrase "went in and out" was an idiom meaning familiar and unhindered <u>access</u>.

They must have been an eyewitness to the resurrection.

Note that both of these conditions were completely under the control of Christ.

b. The <u>commission</u> for an apostle (1:22)

An apostle is to present <u>eyewitness</u> testimony of the resurrection (cf. Acts 1:8). Their testimony has been recorded in the Scripture and has been <u>entrusted</u> to us.

c. The <u>choice</u> for an apostle (1:23-26)

Should Paul have been chosen as the twelfth apostle? No

1) The apostles presented two qualified men

- 2) The apostles <u>prayed</u> for the Lord's guidance
- 3) The apostles <u>picked</u> a successor by lot

May God give us the grace to trust Him to work through the leadership of our church.

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
