Valley Bible Church Sermon Notes for November 28, 2010

"A Bad Example of Giving" Acts 5:1-11

The story of Ananias and Sapphira (Acts 5:1-11) is positioned in stark contrast to the story of Barnabas (Acts 4:36-37) for the purpose of <u>emphasis</u>.

1. The death of Ananias (5:1-6)

a. Sinful deception (5:1-2)

Ananias' sin was deceit, not failure to give completely.

b. Selfish desire (5:3-4)

Ananias' motivation was <u>pride</u> more than <u>greed</u>. When we seek spiritual respect without full commitment, we are guilty of the sin of Ananias.

The role of <u>Satan</u>: Satan communicates the world's <u>values</u> to tempt our mind and cause our heart to be filled with <u>lies</u>.

The role of the <u>Spirit</u>: When we fail to be <u>filled</u> with the Spirit, we are vulnerable to being filled with the lies of Satan.

Note: Peter affirms the deity of the Holy Spirit.

c. Sudden death (5:5)

While all sin is against God, sin against God's <u>church</u> is particularly serious.

Prevarication and pride destroy fellowship.

At key moments in history, God judged specific sin in order to communicate the <u>seriousness</u> of rebellion to His people (Genesis 3; Leviticus 10:1-2; Joshua 7). d. Subsequent dread (5:5-6)

The young men were not professional undertakers but were on hand and were referenced to testify to the <u>fact</u> of this event.

2. The death of Sapphira (5:7-11)

Sapphira is included in this account as <u>proof</u> of the supernatural judgment of God.

Sapphira's answer proved her <u>conspiracy</u> with her husband in his lie, and that she continued the deceit herself.

b. Selfish desire (5:9)

We put the Holy Spirit to the test when we <u>presume</u> that God will act or will not act in a certain manner (cf. Matthew 4:7; Acts 15:10).

c. Sudden death (5:10)

Just as the couple was joined in sin, so were they joined in death.

d. Subsequent dread (5:11)

This is the first use of the word "<u>church</u>" in Acts and comes at a time when the church is threatened from <u>within</u>.

This great fear did not stop the growth of the church. God's work in the lives of people is <u>unstoppable</u>.

We must exercise care when we consider what activities will or will not aid the <u>evangelistic</u> ministry of the church.

May we have the commitment to Christ to do His will regardless of the circumstances for His glory a<u>lone</u>.
