Valley Bible Church Sermon Notes for September 22, 2013

Christ is Superior to the Angels Hebrews 1:13-14

The author of the Book of Hebrews saw Christ as superior to the Old Testament <u>prophets</u> in Hebrews 1:1-4.

The author of Hebrews saw Christ as superior to the <u>angels</u> in Hebrews 1:5-2:18.

The author of Hebrews explained Christ's superiority to the angels in Hebrews 1:5-14.

The author of Hebrews, quoting the Old Testament, explained that Christ alone should be considered uniquely God's <u>Son</u> and thus superior to all others including the angels (Hebrews 1:5).

The author of Hebrews, quoting the Old Testament, explained that because Christ was being <u>worshipped</u> and <u>served</u> by angels, He should be considered superior to all others including the angels (Hebrews 1:6-7).

The author of Hebrews, quoting the Old Testament, explained that because Christ is <u>eternal</u>, He should be considered superior to all others including the angels (Hebrews 1:8-12).

The author of Hebrews, quoting the Old Testament, explained that because Christ is seated at God's <u>right</u> hand, He is superior to all others including the angels (Hebrews 1:13-14).

The author used the word "but" to mark a <u>contrast</u> between what he had just said about Christ in verses 8-12 with what he was now going to say about angels in verse 13-14.

The Old Testament passage that the author quoted in Hebrews 1:13, to confirm what God had said to Christ and had not said to any angel, was <u>Psalms 110:1</u>

The Son being commanded by His Father to sit at His right hand implied <u>kingship</u>, <u>authority</u> and <u>supremacy</u>.

Using one's vanquished enemies as a footstool was a common way for a conquering king to emphasize his <u>victory</u> (Joshua 10:24).

The enemies of Christ will be made His <u>footstool</u> at His second coming (Revelation 19:15-16).

May God give us the grace to understand that because Christ is at the right hand of God and the angels of God are subject to Christ, we have nothing to <u>fear</u> from the forces of darkness
